It was created in 2007 by The German Marshall Fund of the United States, with the support of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID), Charles Stewart Mott Foundation, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Romania, the Government of Latvia, and the Lynde and Harry Bradley Foundation, the Robert Bosch Stiftung and Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation and the European Commission.

For over a decade now, BST has been strengthening regional cooperation, civil society, and democratic foundations in the countries of the Black Sea region. In particular, BST has focused on building trust among citizens and in the public institutions, affirming the value of citizen participation in the democratic process, promoting the involvement of civil society in conflict resolution, and fostering regional cross-border ties in the public, private, and nonprofit sectors.

UN Women Georgia

The Georgian chapter of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women entered Georgia in 2001. After the 2008 Russo-Georgian war, the group's main direction has shifted towards the empowerment and active involvement of conflict-affected women, following on from the needs assessment of these women and internally displaced women emphasizing gender gaps in a humanitarian setting. Current interventions also involve providing support to the achievement of gender equality in Georgia.

UN Women Moldova

The Moldovan chapter of the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women aims to encourage the commitments to gender equality and empowerment of women in Moldova, as commitments to conventions continue to lag. Women in Moldova face social, economic and political barriers - particularly in education and labour. The chapter aims to empower women and improve women's opportunities, as well as ensuring a life free of violence.



European Institute for Political Studies in Moldova

The EIPSM aims to contribute to the establishment of a genuine democratic culture by training a new Moldovan political elite, involving leaders of political parties and civil society, to be able to equip those in Moldova with the skills and capacities necessary to encourage Moldovan society to move towards values and principles held by the Euro-Atlantic community.

Yerevan School of Political Studies



Yerevan School of Political Studies (YSPS) aims to strengthen an open democratic society in Armenia by encouraging young leaders to learn more about politics and contribute to the building of an open democratic society. YSPS encourages free and constructive discussion on a country's democratic development and serves as an open platform for brainstorming. It promotes political education which it finds essential for young people's more constructive engagement in politics.

About the program

The project aims at empowering women from Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries and equipping them in leadership skills necessary to run their own project in their respective countries. It targets young professionals and emerging leaders; women who have already shown both a leadership potential and ambition. The program will focus on enabling women in three core areas: personal leadership, organizational leadership, and empowering leadership. The project will include direct deliverable of two in-country high-level meetings in each EaP country, conducted by the participants. This process will be supervised by mentors, who will provide necessary assistance, knowledge and motivation. With completing the project we hope to see structures of Women in International Security affiliates emerge later on. The program will thus empower women and give them an opportunity to start their careers as leaders in the international security field. The program is co-financed by Black Sea Trust.

2-days workshop, online

Organizational leadership builds on the participants' professional leadership skills, moving the focus from the self to the organization, providing soft skills and hard knowledge on how to make a positive impact on the organization.



2-days workshop, Warsaw

Personal leadership builds leadership skills, self-confidence and assertiveness among participants, to equip them in necessary tools to lead their future projects.

Mentoring sessions

Empowering leadership teaches participants how to mentor other women and share skills. Participants will meet with their mentors – women with international careers in fields of security, experienced in various elements of leadership such as decisiveness, strategic planning and more.

In-country meetings

During the project, participants will be required to organize 2 in-country meetings with high-representatives of international politics and security for women from their communities. Such meetings will be an opportunity to apply their learnings and prove themselves as successful leaders.

Summary meeting

The completion of the project's realistic trainings, will hopefully lead to establishing Women in International Security (WIIS) structures. A 3-day summary meeting of the participants is planned to take place in Warsaw. During this they will have a chance to further motivate themselves, but also take part in last project meetings with experts.

The participants will be recruited through an open call, on the basis of personal statement, curriculum vitae and filled application form. 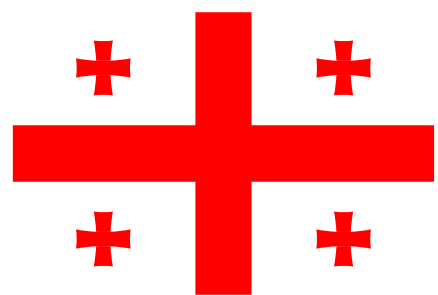
