About the Course

Background

Ageing cannot be prevented, but as a society, we can learn how to provide services that will support, assist and assure the best conditions for older person's population.

The role of the community is essential for assuring the healthy, safe and dignified aging process. Age-friendly services, public spaces and living conditions are crucial to improve the life of older people and their families. Naturally, aged populations have to cope with issues such as health and nutrition, employment and finances, (in)dependence and loneliness, as well as the digital divide. In addition, nowadays senior citizens are expecting to take an active participation in all processes and decisions related to their well-being. Thus, the importance of a holistic approach involving all stakeholders.

Aims

- To analyze and understand how to improve the urban environment for the diverse needs of older people
- Analyze issues in areas such as law, public policy, communications, design and practice related to community services and development using age-based lens
- To discuss the challenges faced by older persons as they age (in various types of environments), including the digital divide
- Exchange information about the concept of ageing in various cultures
- Exchange experiences and ideas on concepts, programs and methodologies applied in participants' countries, as well as those used in Israel

Main Subjects

The program includes lectures, workshops and study visits on:

- Indicators for an Optimal Aging
- Community programs for older persons
- Age-friendly cities (including transportation/mobility, technology and public spaces) – focus on UN-Habitat experience
- Innovative Israeli model – muni100
- Developing and managing services for the older persons (at the local and national level)
- Health services for older persons
- Urban basic services and housing for older persons – UN-Habitat's perspective
- Up 60+ (Retirement preparation centers)
- Innovation and technology for older persons and coping with the digital divide

Application

Application Requirements

The Course is intended for professionals working in social service organizations, officials from national government and local authorities; NGO representatives; representatives of health care and social security programs. Age requirements are 30-55 years old.

A good command of spoken and written English is essential.

Participants must arrive at the training center on the arrival date, and leave on the departure date. Early arrivals/late departures if required, must be arranged by the participants themselves, directly with the center, and must be paid for by the participant him/herself.

Location and Accommodation

MASHAV awards a limited number of scholarships. The scholarship covers the cost of the training program including lectures and field visits, full board accommodation in double rooms (two participants per room), health insurance (see below) and transfers to and from the airport.

Airfares and daily allowance are not included in the scholarship.

Health Services

Medical insurance covers medical services and hospitalization in case of emergency. It does not cover the treatment of chronic or serious diseases, specific medications taken by the participant on a regular basis, dental care and eyeglasses. Health authorities recommend that visitors to Israel make sure they have been inoculated against tetanus in the last ten years. Subject to the full binding policy conditions. Participants are responsible for all other expenses.

The course will be held at The Golda Meir Mashav "Carmel" International Training Center, situated in Haifa. Participants will be accommodated at MCTC in double rooms (two participants per room).

The Golda Meir Mount Carmel International Training Center (MCTC) was established in 1961 to assist in the training of women engaged in community work in the newly emerging states in Africa and Asia. Since the establishment of MCTC, more than 30,000 participants from over 147 countries in Asia, Africa, Europe, Central Asia, Eastern Europe, Latin America, the Middle East, Oceania, and the Caribbean have attended over 700 capacity building programs, workshops, and 31 biannual International Conferences for Women Leaders, conducted in Israel.

MCTC focuses on three areas of study: Community Development, Early Childhood Education, and Organization and Management of Microenterprises, all with gender as a cross-cutting issue. In each training program there are up to 26 women and men from 10 to 27 countries. Usually two workshops are conducted concurrently in different languages (English, French, Spanish, Russian, or Arabic).

The Center is located on Mount Carmel in Haifa. The building consists of living accommodation and classrooms, as well as recreation and dining facilities. Wi-Fi is available on the premises.

MCTC enjoys the active cooperation of a number of international organizations, governmental and non-governmental organizations and development authorities.
